Figures:

According to 2009-2013 FINA Synchronized Swimming Manual for Judges, Coaches, & Referees (p. 34)

“All judgements are made from the standpoint of perfection.”

“Unless otherwise specified in the description, figures shall be executed high and controlled, in uniform motion, and with each section clearly defined.”

Routine:

Each routine will receive a mark for technical merit and one for artistic impression. The average of these two scores, is the Routine Score.

Technical Merit Score is comprised of the following:

	Solo	Duet	Team
Execution	50%	40%	40%
Synchronization	10%	30%	30%
Difficulty	40%	30%	30%

Each judge shall award three scores from 0-10 points. The computer scoring program will calculate the total score for each individual judge by multiplying the judge's score for the component times the weighting for that component. The three component scores will be added together to determine the Judges Final Mark (to two decimal places).

Artistic Impression Score is comprised of the following:

	Solo	Duet	Team
Choreography	50%	50%	50%
Music Interpretation	20%	30%	30%
Manner of Presentation	30%	20%	20%

Once again, like the technical merit score, each judge shall award three scores from 0-10 points. The computer scoring program will calculate the total score for each individual judge by multiplying the judge's score for the component times the weighting for that component. The three component scores will be added together to determine the Judges Final Mark (to two decimal places).
